Learning Domain	Levels of Learning
Cognitive (Intellect)	Knowledge Comprehension Application Analysis Synthesis Evaluation Understanding
Affective (Emotion, heart, passion)	Willing to listen Responding positively Change in attitude Integrating new values
Behavior (Action)	Acting consistently with new value

Format for Objectives

- ⇒ Should be written from learner's point of view
- ⇒ Should reflect a general goal or level for learning
- ⇒ Should state how learners will demonstrate the achievement
- ⇒ Should be expressed clearly

Learners will demonstrate (level of learning) of (content) by (action)

Learners will demonstrate their understanding of John 11 by explaining how Jesus helps people and gives them hope.

Learners will demonstrate their appreciation for John 11 by committing their current crises to God in prayer and action.

Learners will evaluate 1 Peter 2:13-25 and Colossians 3:17-23 and serve enthusiastically in the workplace.

Learners will integrate 1 Peter 2:13-25 by making their workplace a place of worship.



Adult Bible Study Fellowship Teaching for Transformation

Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God. (Romans 12:2 HCSB)

Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you. (Romans 12:1-2 The Message)
